The Collaboration for Enhanced Research Impact [CERI] is a joint initiative between the Prevention Centre and four NHMRC Centres of Research Excellence, established in June 2020 to enhance the profile and impact of chronic disease prevention in Australia.

We are working together to find alignment in the policy and practice implications of our work and to develop shared communications across our various projects and participating centres.

We share a dedicated communications adviser to help our members develop evidence-informed narratives and policy briefs for policy makers and research funders about systems approaches to chronic disease prevention.

We are available to support researchers across the CREs to develop:

- Position statements
- Policy submissions and briefs
- News stories and media releases
- Storytelling – features, videos, podcasts
- Opinion pieces and blogs

It is intended that these communications should go beyond the findings of individual research projects and CREs to encapsulate our shared narratives - what we want to say collectively about the prevention of chronic disease.
