About CERI

CERI launched as a 12-month pilot in June 2020, comprising the Prevention Centre and four affiliated CREs. Further CREs have joined the collaboration from June 2021. It has grown rapidly to represent CREs nationally.

How it works

The Steering Group provides high-level guidance and strategic direction on CERI activities. It comprises two senior representatives of each member CRE.

The Coordinating Group is CERI's operational body. It comprises two EMCR representatives from each CRE. The Coordinating Group is primarily concerned with developing networking and capacity building opportunities for EMCRs, and its members also contribute expertise to CERI's outputs.

The Prevention Centre provides:

- Opportunities to access a wide network of policy and practice partners
- Dedicated science communications support
- Dedicated events management support
- Weekly events and opportunities newsletter to the entire network
- Access to Prevention Centre capacity building opportunities.
